Kids ages six to 22 participated in Scituate Community of Resources for Special Education (C.O.R.S.E.) Foundation's innovative water sports program in Scituate harbor from July 23 to 27.



Kids ages six to 22 participated in [Scituate Community of Resources for Special Education \(C.O.R.S.E.\)](#) Foundation event "Maritime Adventures" on July 23 to 27 in Scituate harbor. Sponsored by C.O.R.S.E. and Marine Park, the innovative water sports program features a variety of water activities for kids of all abilities, organizers said.



During the week-long camp, the athletes built skills in adaptive windsurfing, Hawaiian outrigger canoeing, sailing and stand-up paddling.



The week culminated on Friday with a team outrigger canoe race.



The camp provides specialized instructors and equipment from AccesSport America. Participating students can be nonambulatory, non-verbal and do not need to know how to swim in order to participate, organizers said.



C.O.R.S.E. sponsored programs have a 3:1 (student to staff) ratio, so there is ample supervision for students with and without special needs.
